Gary W. Redner **December 31, 1952- March 9, 2008**

Born in Queens, NY on December 31, 1952, Gary William Redner was a good man who many will remember for his loyalty and sense of humor. Most of his childhood was spent in Washington, DC along with his sister Chere and brother Richard. Growing up in DC, Gary was a Golden Gloves boxer and state champ in wrestling. Gary's passion through his teen years was music. He played both the guitar and drums. His mother used to let him bang away in the basement, which helped him improve both his skills and confidence.

His father, Earl Redner started Redner's Markets in 1970 in PA and Gary graduated from Wilson High School. Upon graduation, Gary continued to play music in his own band and worked full time in the family business. There were two paths he could have chosen to pursue; music or the family business. He chose the family and helped to grow the business over the years to what it is today.

His specialty in the company was in the perishables and distribution areas. He began buying produce directly from California in the late 90's when the company established its warehouse and distribution facility. Gary's work experience in the stores enabled him to develop strong relationships and helped create what people in the industry have come to know Redner's by...quality food at reasonable prices. Through the 35 plus years with the company Gary was very loyal to both the employees and the vendors with whom he had worked.

Outside of his work life, Gary married Deborah Kerr in January 1978 and continued a courtship through the balance of his life. He helped raise 2 children; Gary M. and Casey. Gary M and wife Jane have 2 children, Kerr and Soleil. Casey Redner Huber and husband Chris have one child, Kayla. Gary was a good family man and succeeded with balancing work and home life.

Gary W. Redner was someone with a unique sense of humor and wit, who touched the lives of many. He was noted for his generosity and ability to forgive those who made the wrong choices. He will always be remembered and his spirit will live on through all of us.

DIRECTIONS

From Philadelphia & South/East:

Route 422 West towards Reading/Lebanon. After the Arby's on your right and Burger King on your left, stay in your left lane onto 422 West (DO NOT take 422 Business/Mt. Penn). Go approx. 10 miles and the road will split (to Rt. 12). Stay in the left lane and continue to follow 222 N. Take the Broadcasting Rd. exit. Turn right onto Broadcasting Rd. through lights to stop sign. Turn right at stop sign onto Tulpehocken Rd. Gring's Mill will be on your left, across from Penn State-Berks Campus

From Lancaster/York & South/West:

Route 222 North towards Reading/Allentown. Stay on 222 N until you see the exit for Broadcasting Rd. Take the Broadcasting Rd. exit. Turn right onto Broadcasting Rd. to stop sign. Turn right at the stop sign onto Tulpehocken Rd. Gring's Mill will be on your left, across from Penn State-Berks Campus.

From the Reading Area:

From Route 12: 422 West/Warren Street Bypass until Paper Mill Rd. exit. At the end of the ramp, continue straight. At the next light (Berkshire Blvd.), turn right. Take this road until it ends. Turn left onto Tulpehocken Rd. Go approx. 2 miles. Gring's Mill will be on your right, across from Penn State-Berks Campus.

From Allentown & North: Rt. 22/78 West toward Harrisburg. Exit at Route 100 S/Fogelsville. Wawa is on left at turn. Cross the railroad tracks. Turn right at the light onto Shantz Rd. and follow towards Reading. At stop sign (Mobil Gas on your left), go straight. This road is Route 222 S. Travel 222 toward Reading (past Kutztown). At Maiden Creek, (approx. 1 mile after the Rt. 73 intersection) take the 222 South exit on your right. Follow this four-lane highway to the Broadcasting Rd. exit to the light. Turn left at the light onto Broadcasting Rd. Continue straight through the lights. Go to the stop sign; turn right onto Tulpehocken Rd. Gring's Mill will be on your left directly across from Penn State-Berks Campus.
